

Vision

Our vision is to conserve the distinct rural character and heritage of the chalk downland villages of Broad Hinton, Winterbourne Bassett and Uffcott, while ensuring a safe and thriving community.

It is the year 2038, the villages have a population of around 1000 people.

There are many more younger families helping sustain the school, and playgrounds and community groups to support them. People can downsize in retirement and stay within their community.

The village hall has become a thriving centre including further community facilities, and still has many clubs and events run by volunteers. There are community hubs across the villages with a community-owned cafe, small shop, workspaces, additional parking, and Churches used for worship and community activities. The pubs and restaurant have never been busier with locals and tourists.

The heritage and views up to and from the Ridgeway and White Horse are still so inspirational, connections between the villages and beyond have improved and the walks around the many byways and footpaths are still enjoyed by all.
